Representatives from CareSouth Carolina as well as community leaders gathered on August 25, 2022, at noon to celebrate a groundbreaking ceremony for its newest facility.

Located at 812 State Road, in Cheraw, S.C., the location will provide much-needed space and relieve overcrowding at the current location – 715 S. Doctors Drive, Suite E – according to CareSouth Carolina CEO Ann Lewis.

"Although CareSouth Carolina has had groundbreakings for three other new buildings over the past several years, this groundbreaking in Cheraw is especially exciting," Lewis said. "The location is great and having this new building will solve the significant overcrowding problems in our current location. We look forward to expanding services and introducing new ones.

Cheraw Mayor Andy Ingram thanked CareSouth Carolina for their work. "On behalf of the town of Cheraw, we welcome this new healthcare facility to our community and we want to thank CareSouth Carolina for your commitment to provide quality healthcare to citizens of the Cheraw area," he said. S.C. Rep Richie Yow also praised CareSouth Carolina for its commitment to serving the residents of rural areas like Cheraw. "CareSouth Carolina is part of small town, rural South Carolina that has grown our medical care. Home-grown care with its staff that is making a difference in the lives of our community, the lives you've touched with the children in our schools, and we're just so thankful for you," Yow said.

"This is a great day for Chesterfield County," added S.C. Rep. Pat Henegan. "I always say, 'Let the work I've done speak for me,' and CareSouth Carolina lets its work speak for itself." Henegan, who is also a CareSouth Carolina Board Member, called it a "day of celebration" and said, "We are thrilled to share the day with our patients, our nurses, our other staff members, the entire community."

CareSouth Carolina's Chief of Community Health Joe Bittle also attended the event. "This is great for Cheraw and the communities around, to be able to bring this facility here, and especially the location to make things more accessible to everyone," he said. "Our CSC doors are open to everyone. All are welcome! No one person leaves here without being seen."

The pharmacy, located at 1268 South Fourth Street in Hartsville, opened its doors in June of 2020, but a celebration was delayed because of COVID restrictions.

"Having this new building for our Hartsville CSC Community Pharmacy with a drive-thru had been a dream for several years," said Ann Lewis, CareSouth Carolina CEO. Previously located inside the existing CareSouth Carolina

medical office building at the same address, the need for more space arose and both Lewis and Ashley Singleton, Chief of Pharmacy, agree the new location offers a great deal more space and convenience.

"With our "old" location patients had to park to go inside (not good in bad weather!) and often wait in long, crowded lines," said Lewis. "This new location has made access for patients and a work place for employees much more pleasant and safe."

"Moving our pharmacy from inside the doctor's office to a free-standing location has added more access for our patients," said Singleton. "The addition of the drive-thru has made it more convenient for customers to drop off and pick up prescriptions without the hassle of having to leave their vehicle."

Even if you are not a CareSouth Carolina patient, the CSC Community Pharmacy is open to all and has eight convenient locations that are open from 8:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday through Friday. "CSC Community Pharmacy not only provides medications at significant discounts but helps support many CSC programs and services," said Lewis.

CareSouth Carolina Awarded an Outreach and Enrollment Grant

CareSouth Carolina recently received a grant for \$664,179 from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Resources, according to Marek Calhoun, Community Services Director for CareSouth Carolina. Calhoun said the money will be used over a three-year period to fund outreach and enrollment strategies aimed at educating families about the availability of Medicaid and Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP) and directly assists families with the application and renewal process.

"This was a very competitive grant," said Calhoun, adding that CareSouth Carolina was the only recipient in the state. "In all, 36 organizations in 20 states were awarded this funding, but we were the only one in South Carolina," he said. Since grant funding initiatives began in 2009, more than 330 awards to eligible entities have been issued for approximately \$265 million to community-based organizations, states, and local governments. Connecting Kids to Coverage (CKC) outreach grants share the common goal of reducing the number of children who are eligible for Medicaid and CHIP but not enrolled.

"At CareSouth Carolina we're in a position to enroll individuals in Medicaid and CHIP," said Calhoun. "One of the things we do is reach out to those in our community who may not even realize these programs are available to them. I think it's important for not only individuals as adults to have access to quality healthcare whether or not they are insured, but it's even more important for our children to have access to health insurance so they can have a long and healthy life."

CareSouth Carolina is offering the COVID-19 Bivalent Booster for eligible patients at several of its locations throughout the area.

These new boosters are called "bivalent" and provide protection against two different COVID-19 strains: the original and the highly contagious omicron variant. The single-shot bivalent boosters may be administered at least two months following the primary vaccination or booster.

The Pfizer booster is available to those who are at least 12 years old, and is only offered at the Hartsville site. The Moderna booster is available to those who are at least 18 years old and only available at the Bishopville, Chesterfield, McColl and Latta sites.

Compton says she knew "at age 11" exactly what she wanted to do in terms of her career and was willing to put in the extra time it takes to become a D.O. "I ultimately chose D.O. over M.D. because they tend to focus more on the whole body and more holistic elements of medicine and we receive an additional 200 hours of training in osteopathic medical manipulation," she said. "So really an understanding of the bones, and the fascia, and the tissue and how it works together."

Compton treats a wide variety of medical issues and says she looks forward to educating patients in Bishopville. "Things that really affect rural populations – diabetes, hypertension – those are things that can really be adjusted by diet and lifestyle. I really like to treat diabetes, hypertension, acne, rosacea and migraines," she said. "Education is a huge issue. Diet, exercise and what those things mean. For example, a lot of patients think they're being healthy by eating a salad – but then they add a lot of cheese, ham, the dressing.
