NATIONAL MINORITY MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH



National Minority Mental Health Awareness Month is observed each July to bring awareness to the unique struggles that racial and ethnic minority communities face regarding mental illness in the United States. The COVID-19 pandemic has made it harder for racial and ethnic minority groups to get access to mental health and substance-use treatment services.

Mental health disorders affect one in four people. Treatments are available, but nearly two-thirds of people

with a known mental disorder never seek help from a health professional.

This year's theme, Give Your Community a Boost! focuses on the continued importance of COVID-19 vaccination, including COVID-19 boosters, and sharing credible information as important tools to end the COVID-19 pandemic that has disproportionately affected communities of color.

"Mental Health does not discriminate, no matter their background, culture, ethnicity or identity," said Amy Cook, Director of Behavioral Health for CareSouth Carolina. "According to the National

Alliance on Mental Illness, minority communities face an added level of stigma and discrimination when trying to access Mental Health services." "CareSouth Carolina provides mental health services to ALL our patients," Cook added. "We have a diverse group of Licensed Professionals that provide counseling regardless of culture, background, ethnicity or identity. It is important


