National HIV Testing Day is June 27th

June 27th is National HIV Testing Day in the United States. Established in 1995, the day aims to encourage people to get tested for HIV, know their status and get linked to care and treatment.

Many national organizations, government bodies and medical care providers join forces to raise the profile of the day and the disease. The day educates people about HIV — what it is, how it is transmitted, who is at risk and the symptoms. It also aims to connect people who suspect they may be at risk to the relevant

places to get tested and to the subsequent care and support available to them.

More than 1.1 million people in the U.S. are living with HIV today, and 1 in 7 of them don't know it. However with awareness continuing to rise and the accessibility to advice and services improving, the annual number of infections in the United States is gradually declining.

HIV/AIDS STATS

- * SC ranks 11th in the nation for AIDS case rates. (SC DHEC)
- * In SC, more than 20,000 men and women are estimated to be living with HIV/AIDS. (SC DHEC)
- * In 2019, approximately 37,000 people were newly diagnosed with HIV in the US. (CDC)
- * In the US, 13% of people with HIV do not know they have the virus. (CDC)
- * People ages 13 to 24 accounted for 21% of all new HIV diagnoses in the US in 2018. (CDC)
