

Percent of 5+ Population with an Updated (Bivalent) Booster Dose^














National Summary of Vaccinations by Race/Ethnicity







Cases: COVID-19 case metrics at the county level are generated using a dataset managed by the CDC which is compiled from state and local health departments; this dataset is updated weekly. Data are through 1/18/2023. Due to a reporting cadence issue, Mississippi's cases in the last week include two weeks of data and are therefore overestimates.


Admissions: Unified Hospitals Dataset in HHS Protect. Data are through 1/17/2023.

Previous week levels are computed based on current data.
