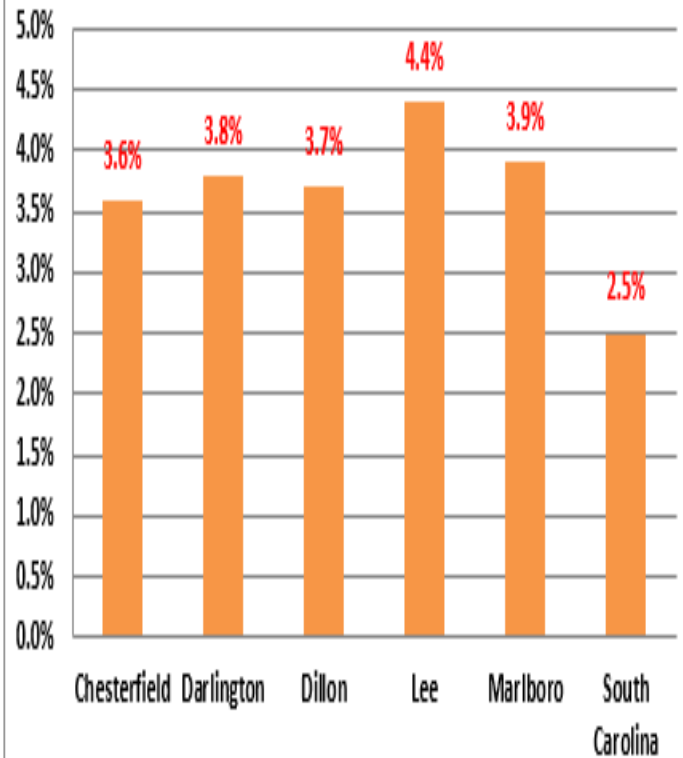

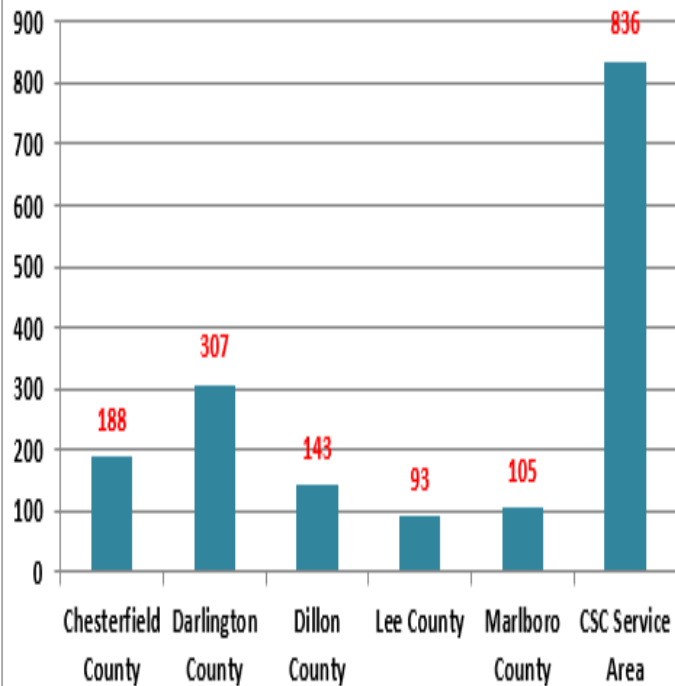

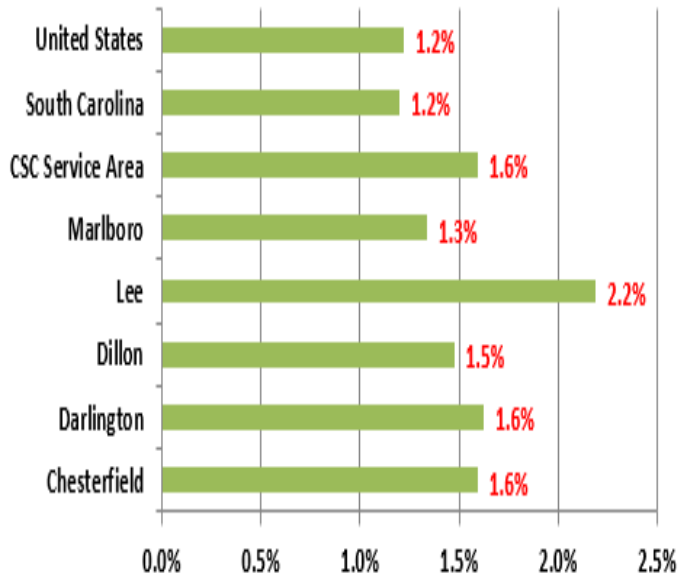

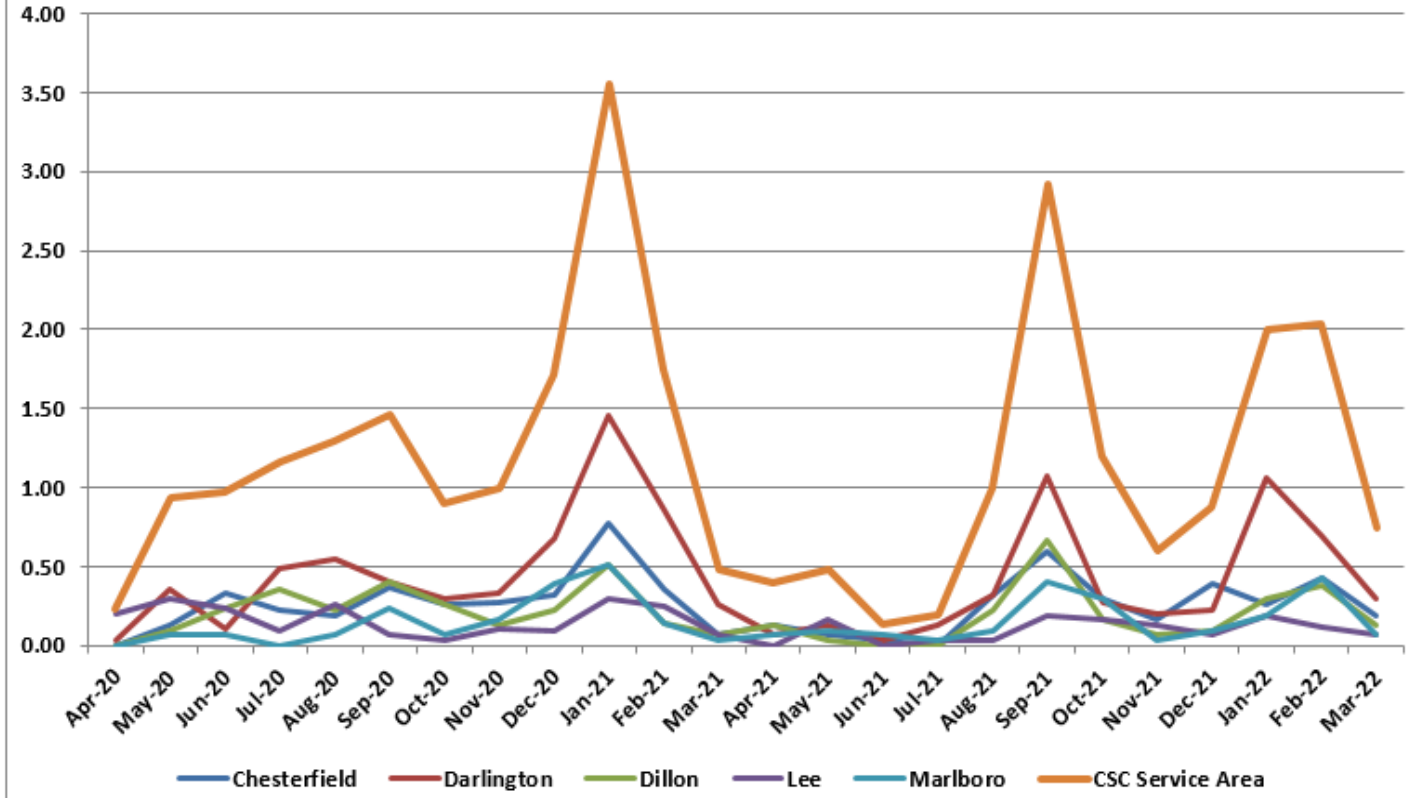
Total Covid Deaths

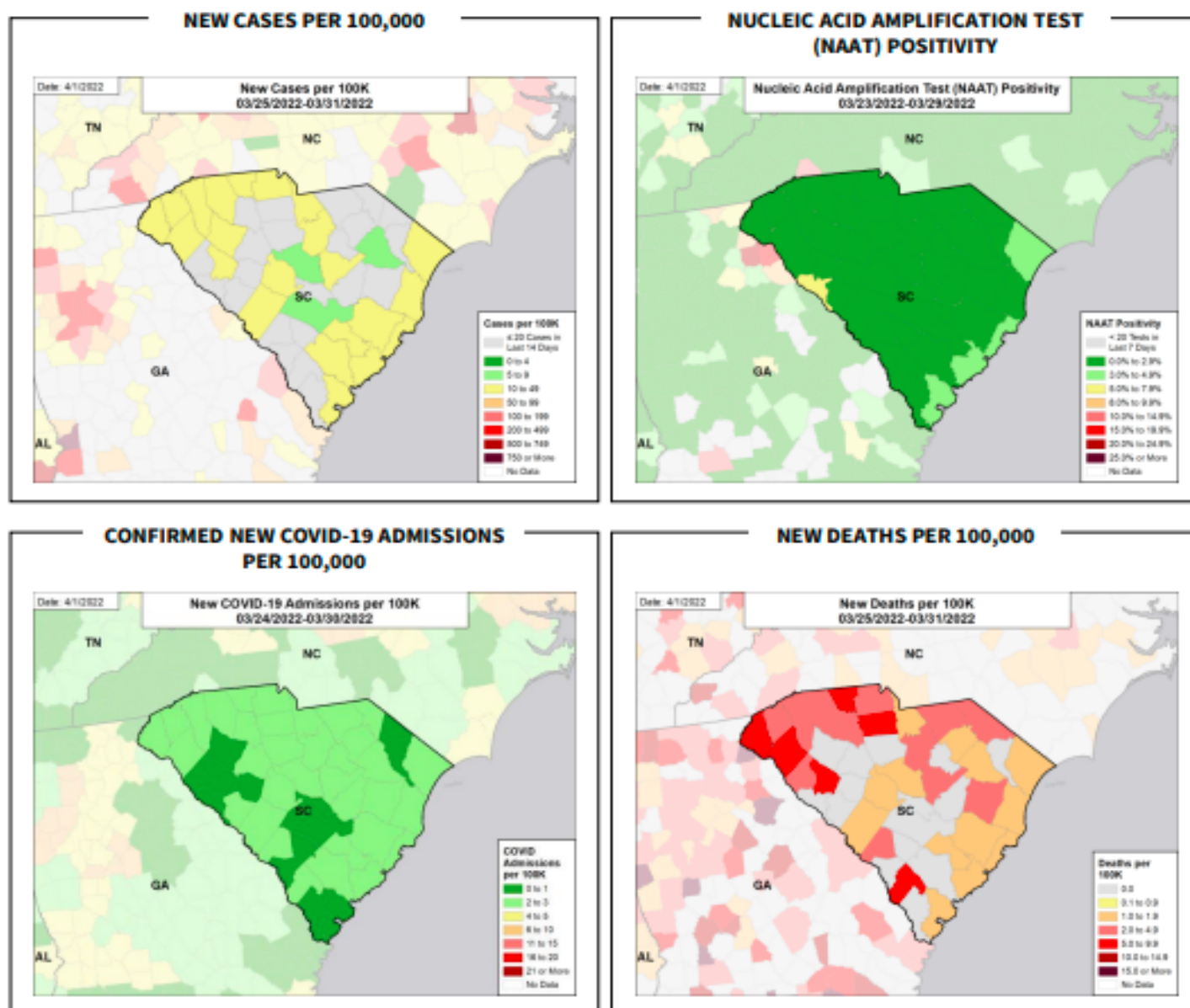

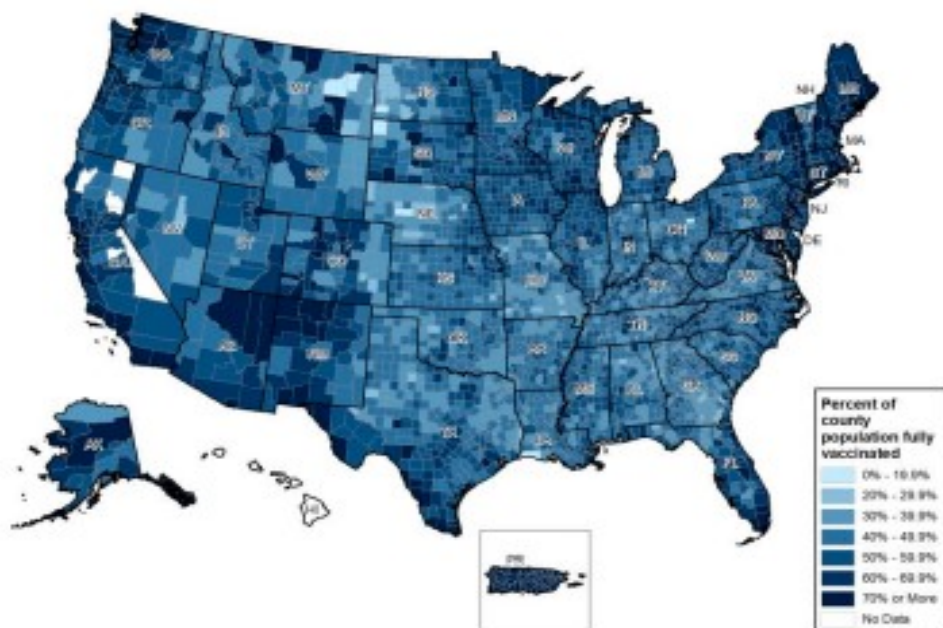

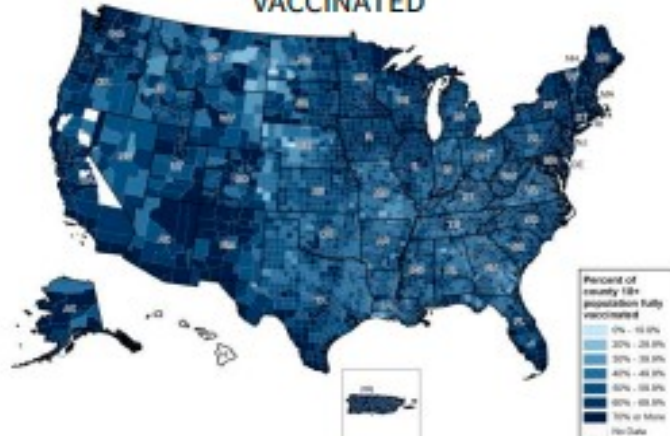
PERCENT OF POPULATION FULLY VACCINATED



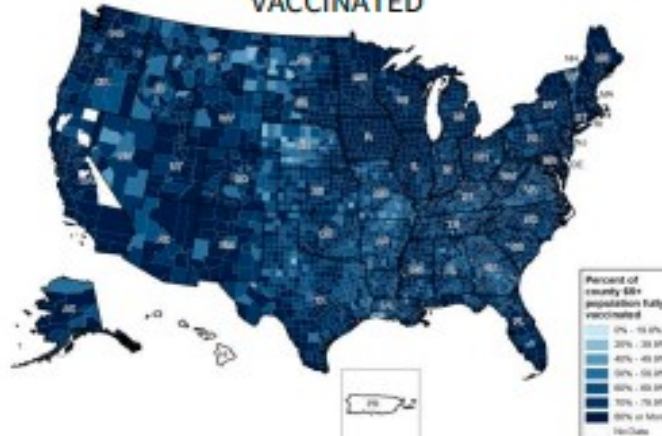

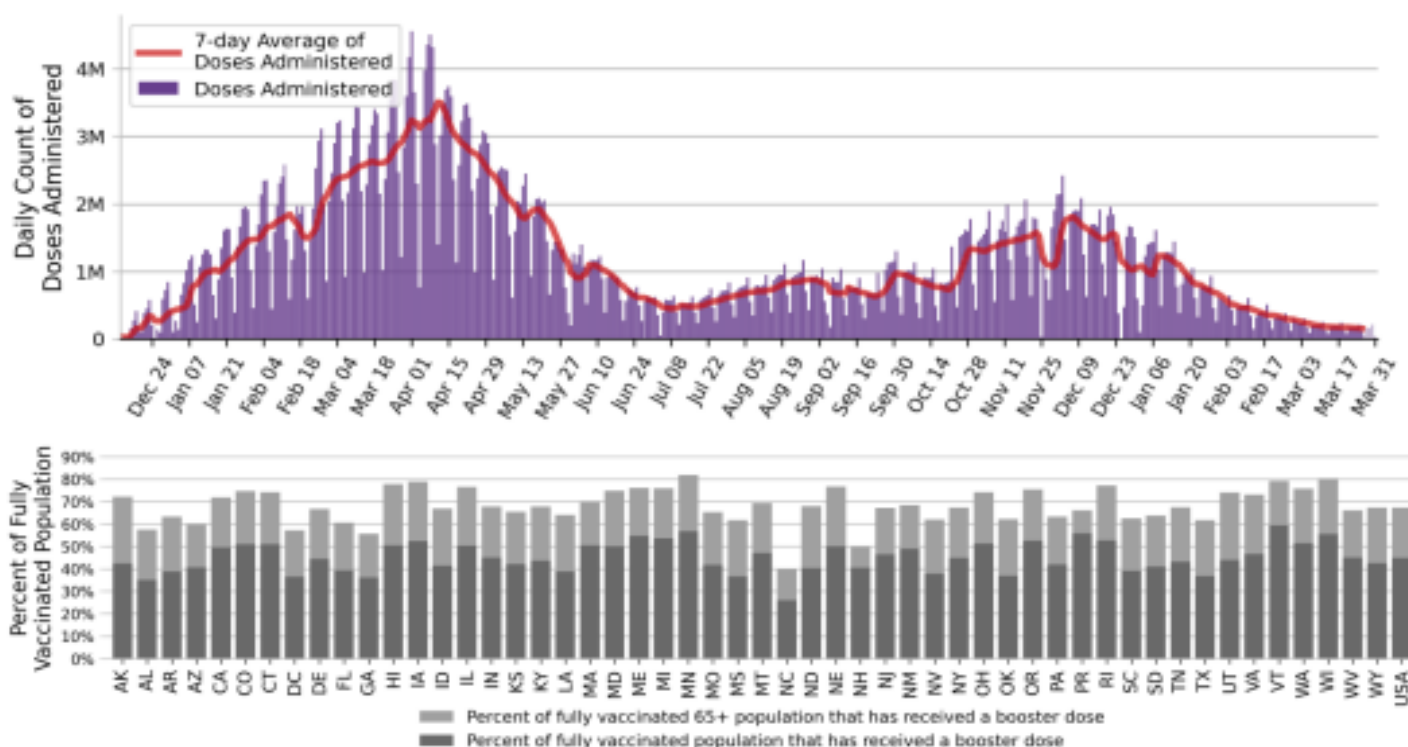

DAILY NATIONAL COUNT OF VACCINE DOSES ADMINISTERED BY DATE OF ADMINISTRATION



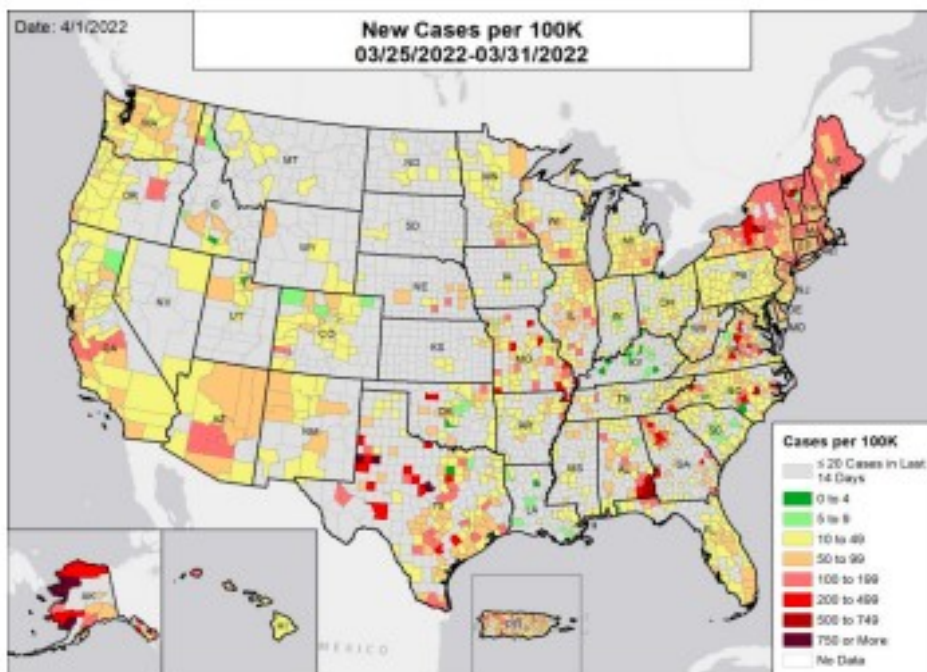

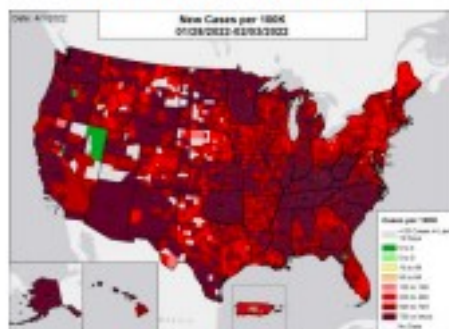

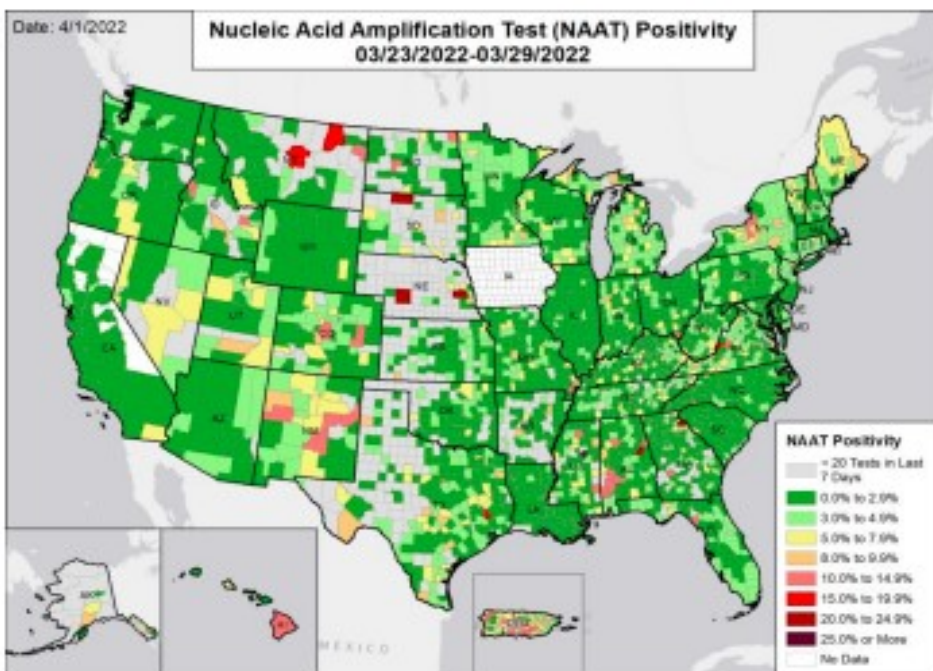

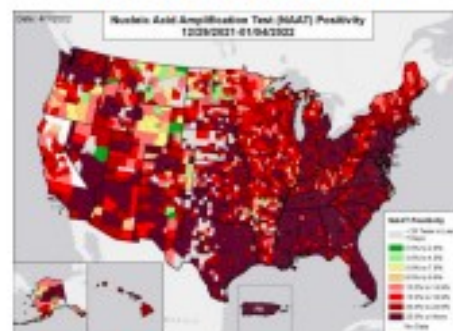

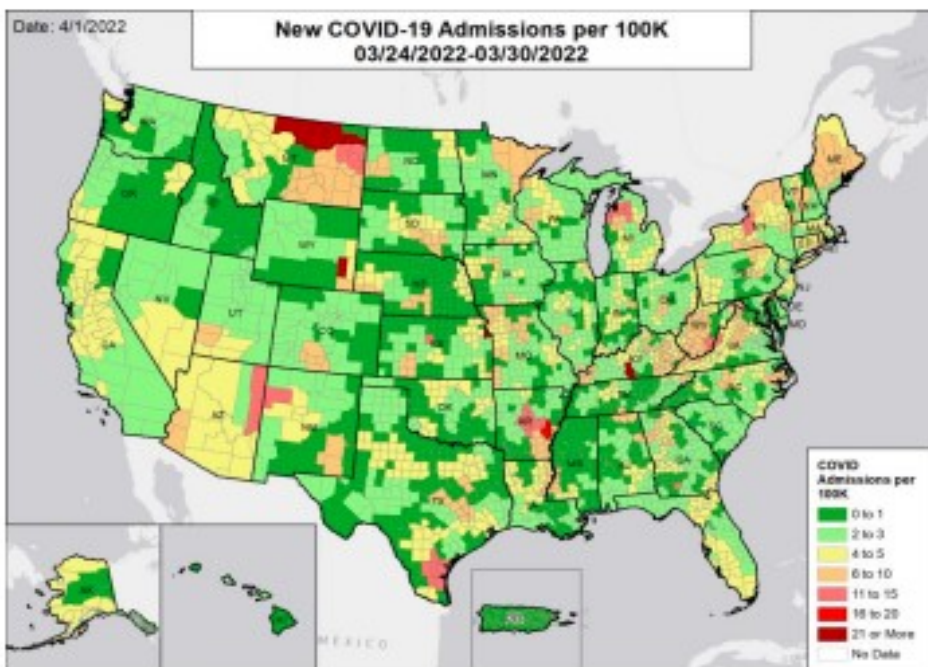

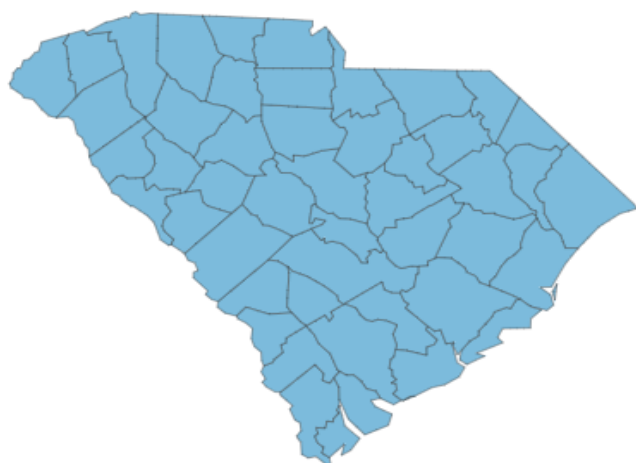

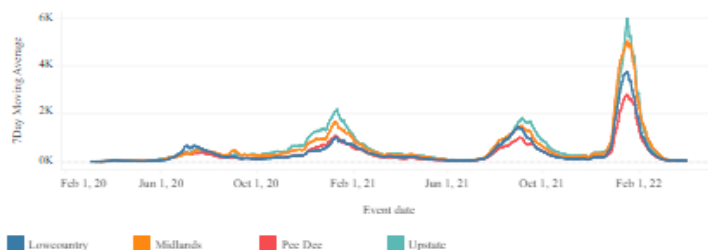

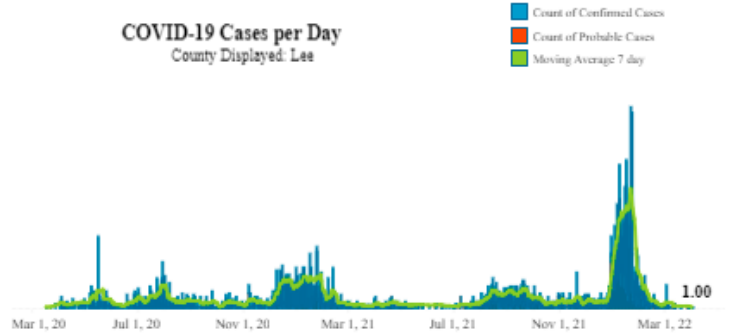

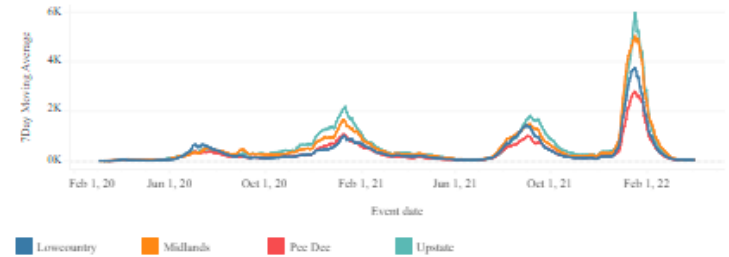

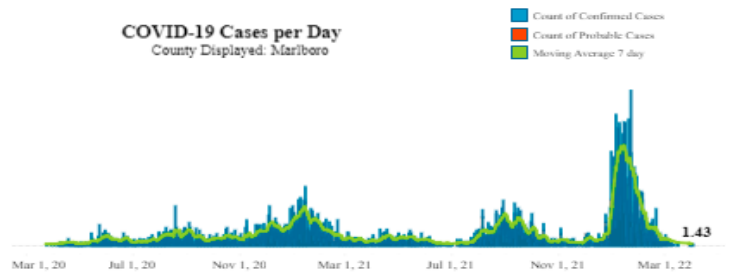

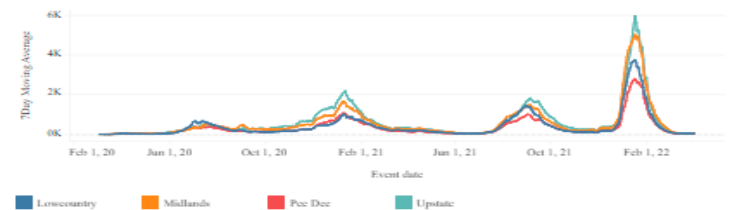

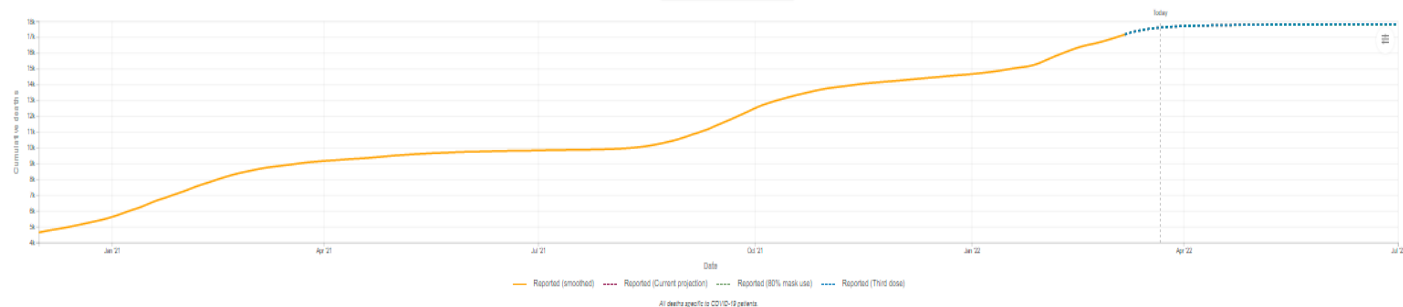

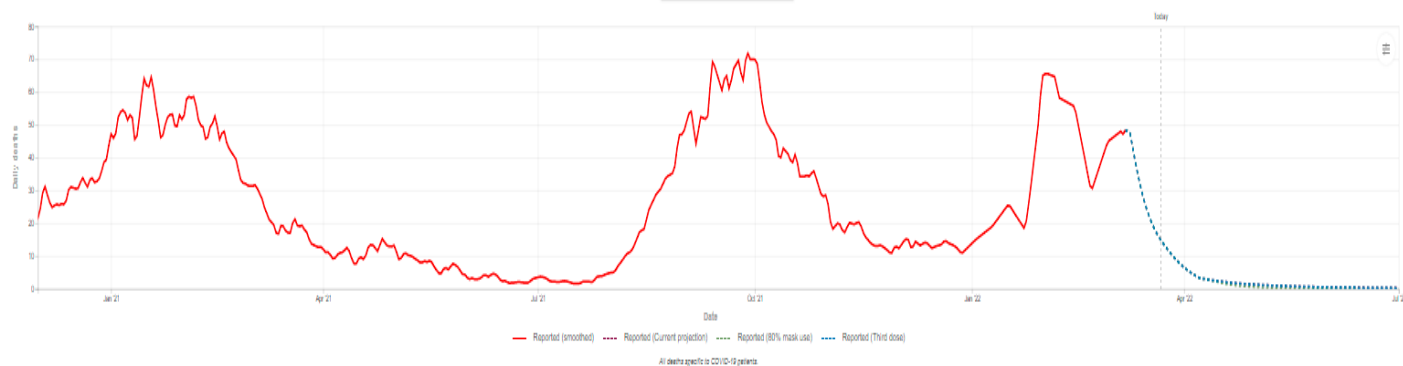

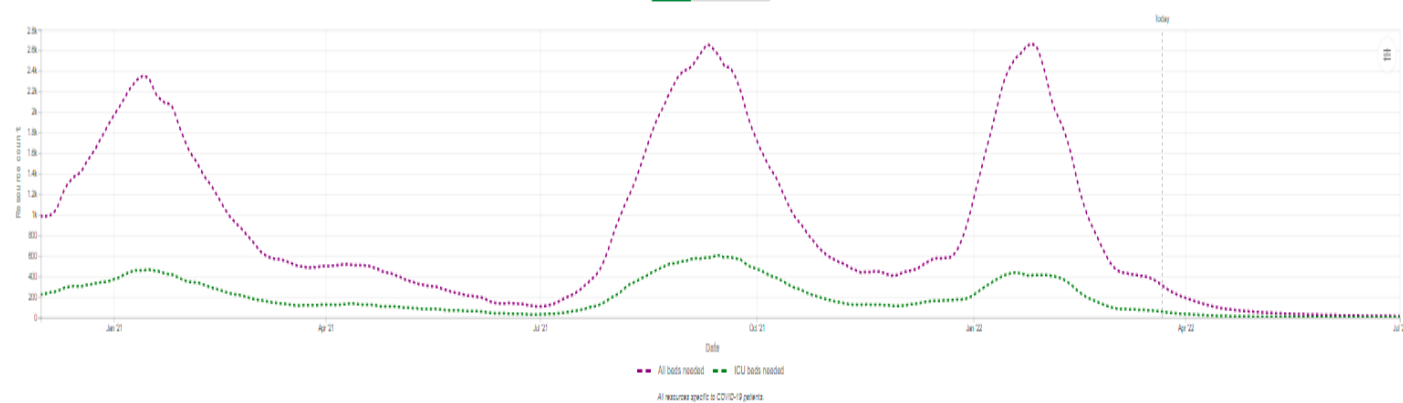

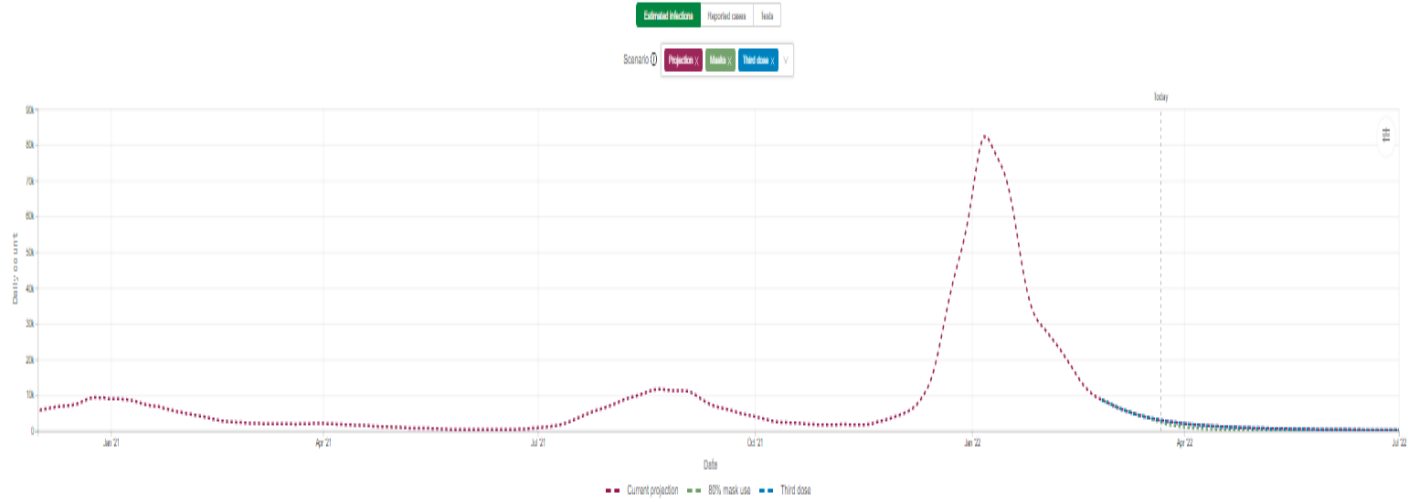

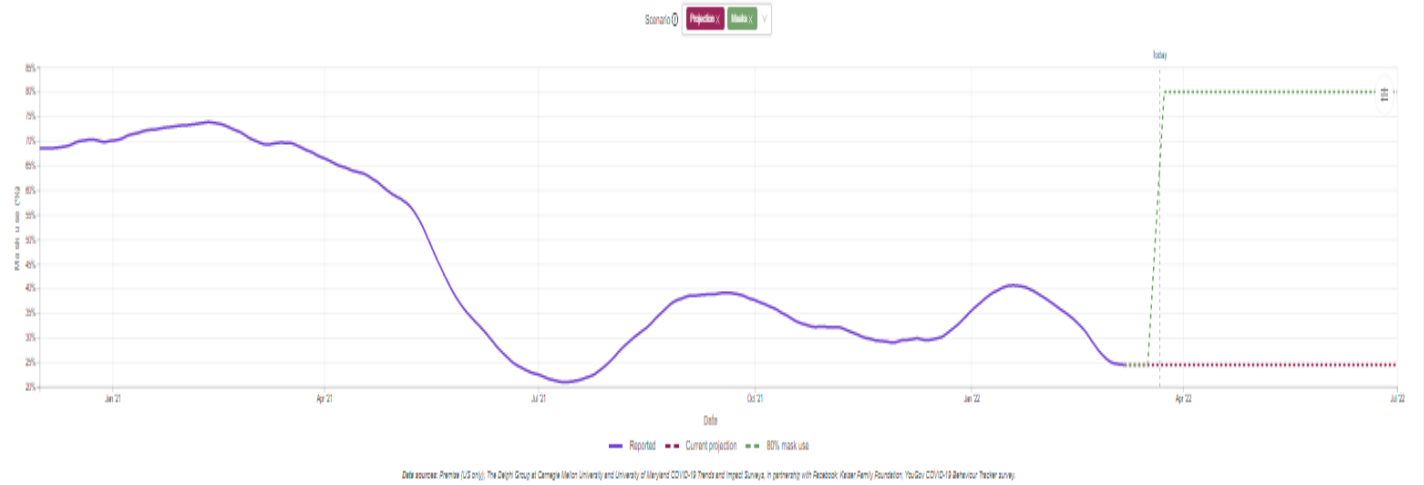

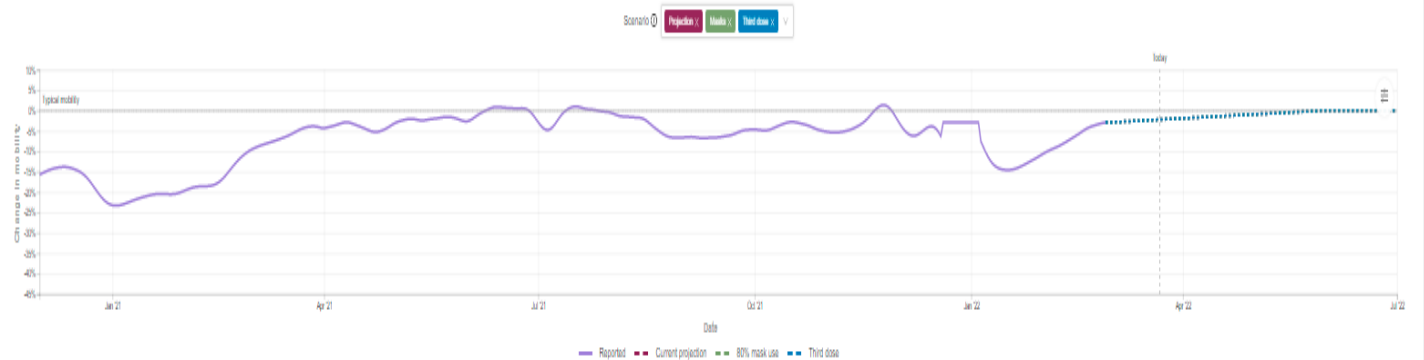

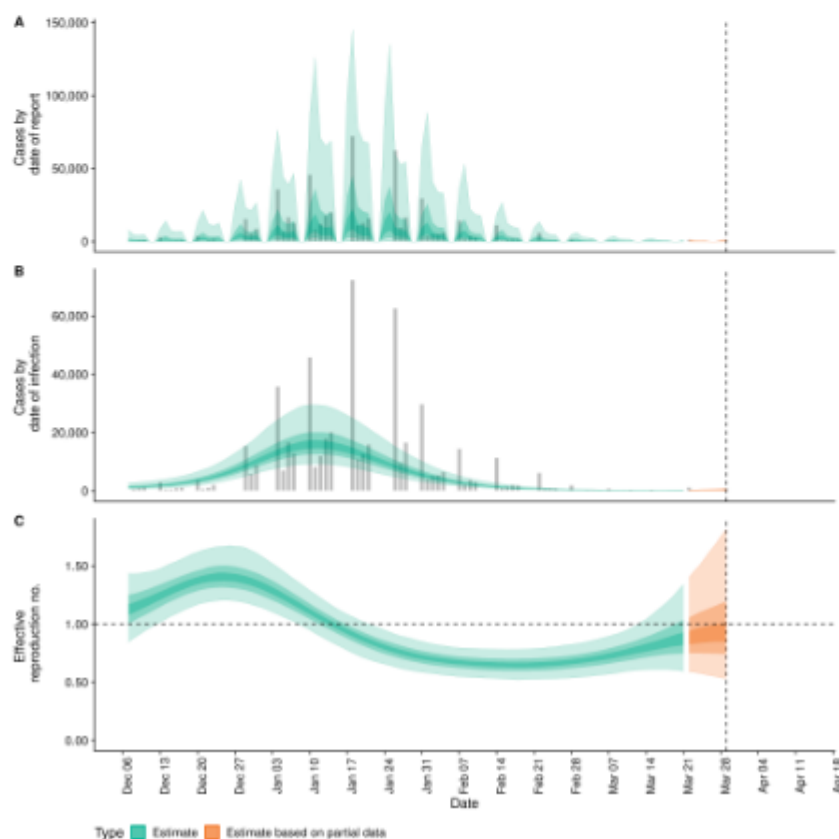

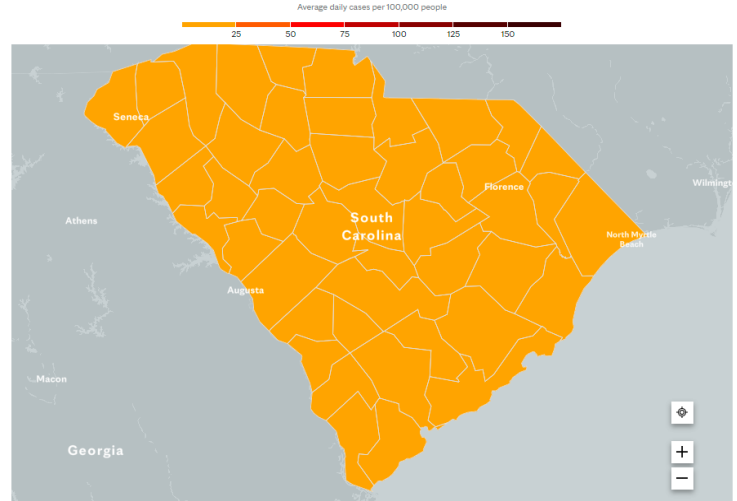


Mayo Clinic Covid Tracker Rate of New Cases

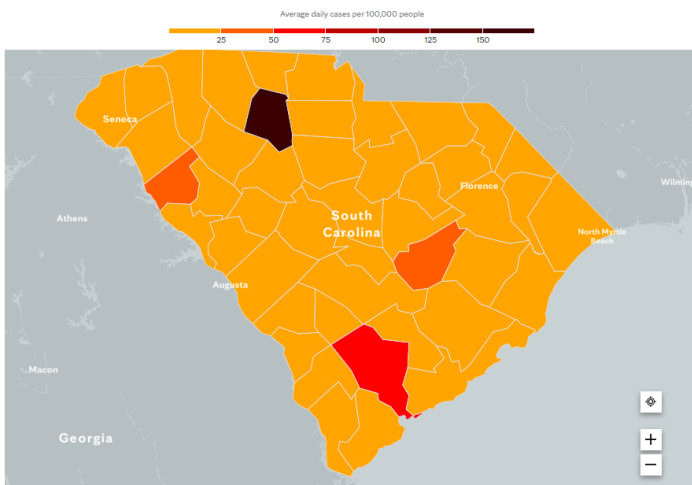
