

#### Percent of 18+ Population Fully Vaccinated
















#### National Ranking of Population **Fully Vaccinated**




#### National Summary of Vaccinations by Race/Ethnicity






#### National Summary of Vaccinations by Age













# Mayo Clinic Covid Tracker Rate of New Cases
